Letter from the Pastor



Four years have passed quickly, in spite of a pandemic that prevented us from gathering to celebrate in person for two years. As I reflected on the past four years and the tumult surrounding the church as societal problems and unrest become more pronounced, I was comforted I have by my belief that God remains in control.

On the fourth day, God created the sun, the moon and the stars, none of which were affected by Covid-19. Each year progressed through the four seasons. Each night was followed by the morning as we continued to move forward day by day. I have found joy as Antioch has, like the sun, moon and stars, continued to be a beacon light in our community and beyond. We have not missed a beat in striving to implement the six-fold ministry outlined in Matthew 25:35-36. We adhere to Matthew 25:40, serving Christ as we do “unto the least of these.”

One of the defining moments of this past year has been my heart operation, when I gained a more profound understanding of Jesus as a “heart fixer.” I may not have remembered that the heart has four chambers from biology class, nor that four valves regulate blood flow through the heart. I did remember that we are each “fearfully and wonderfully made” (Psalm 139:14), and there is no part of us that is hidden from God.

Studies indicate that chronic stress can be a major risk factor leading to a heart attack. Many preachers I know live under constant stress about the congregations they pastor. I am not stressed about how we function as the body of Christ, and I am convinced that because Antioch is so faithful in following me as I follow Christ, God protected me from having a heart attack. When I did not know that I had severe blockages in three arteries, God knew, and he preserved me, directing me to the right medical staff and operating through them.

I thank my Antioch family for your prayers as I underwent surgery—I could literally feel the prayers. I cannot adequately express my gratitude for your many acts of kindness for me and my entire family as I continue to recover. I was heartened to know and strengthened daily by the fact that Antioch continued to “do the work” during the time I had to be away from the physical building and the pulpit.

As we celebrate this fourth anniversary as pastor and flock, through Christ, I can continue to fulfill our theme, 2 Timothy 4:5. With the help of the Holy Spirit, I will remain steadfast in every situation, including those that cause suffering, because as God set his creation in order, I know that “joy comes in the morning” (Psalm 30:5). In the name of Jesus, I will continue to fulfill the ministry that God has called me to, always proclaiming the good news of Jesus Christ.

Our Anniversary Speaker



Reverend Rodney Kirk Turner was born in Atlanta, Georgia. He is the son of Rufus and Betty Turner. He is a product of the Atlanta Public School system and a graduate of the Frederick Douglas High School class of 1975. Rev. Turner obtained his college education at the Historic Morehouse College as a sociology and criminology major. While pursuing his education at Morehouse, Rev. Turner became a member of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity and served as president for two years.

He furthered his biblical education at Carver and Beulah Heights Bible Colleges. In May 2015, Rev. Turner received an Honorary Doctorate of Divinity from Carver College for his twenty-nine years of service work in the field of substance abuse and outreach ministry throughout the State of Georgia and across the country. For nine plus years, Rev. Turner served as Pastor of Canaan Missionary Baptist Church in Roanoke, Alabama and is presently entering his nineteenth year as Pastor and under-shepherd of the Mount Vernon Baptist Church in Atlanta, Georgia. He is a proud father, grandfather, and a loving husband to former State Representative LaNett L. Stanley of Atlanta, GA.

Rev. Turner was licensed to preach in February 1990 and ordained in January 1995 at the Antioch Baptist Church North in Atlanta, Georgia by the late Rev. Dr. C. M. Alexander, Pastor of the Antioch Baptist Church North and President Emeritus of the General Missionary Baptist Convention of Georgia, Inc. While attending Antioch, Rev. Turner served as an associate minister and worked on the staff of Antioch for over seventeen plus years as Antioch's Substance Abuse, AIDS, Prison Ministry and Outreach Coordinator. Rev. Turner is the Founder of one of the nation's most successful recovery ministries, Product of the Power Ministry, a Christian-based recovery ministry that addresses the needs of those suffering with substance abuse issues and other spiritual behavioral disorders. He has authored six books that address how to overcome sin and addiction from a biblical perspective.

Rev. Turner has taught recovery classes in the urban ministries department at Beulah Heights Bible College and has served as a faculty member of the National Baptist Congress of Christian Education, Auxiliary to the National Baptist Convention, U.S.A., Inc. Rev. Turner served for twenty-four years as a faculty member of the General Missionary Baptist Convention of Georgia, Congress of Christian Education, where he taught and lectured on Christian based recovery. He has served as lead columnist for the nationally published magazine Recovery Solutions.

Rev. Turner was a consultant and life skills counselor for twenty-four years with Clark Atlanta University and the Fulton County Judicial system as the senior counselor for Project Redirection. He has served as a chaplain for the Fulton County Jail Division for over twenty years and is a member of the Georgia Sheriff Association Chaplain's Division.

He was a 2017 Inductee into the Morehouse College Martin Luther King Jr. Board of Preachers. Also, in 2017, he received the President Barack Obama's Lifetime Achievement Award for National and Community Service. In June 2019, he was chosen to serve on the Mayor's Task Force to Reimagine the Atlanta City Detention Center as a Center for Equity.

With over thirty-two years of Christ-centered recovery work and outreach initiatives, Rev. Turner has helped countless men and women turn their lives around through a right functioning relationship with Jesus Christ. He is a leader and advocate for the disadvantaged, the hungry and the homeless in the community, always sharing the good news of Jesus Christ. Rev. Turner's motto is, ***"Therefore, if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature, old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new,"*** 2nd Corinthians 5:17.
