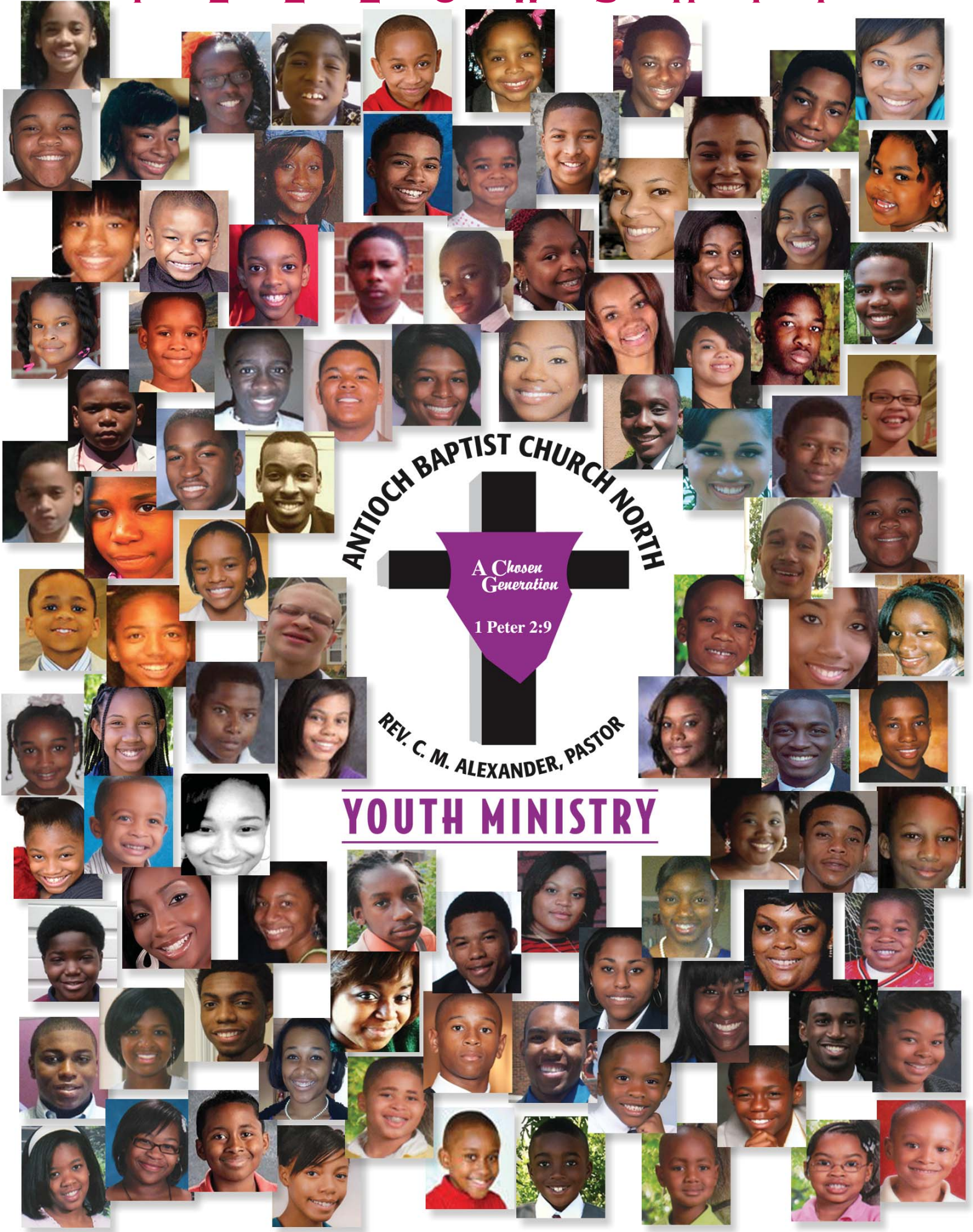

### **Alexis Rockward**

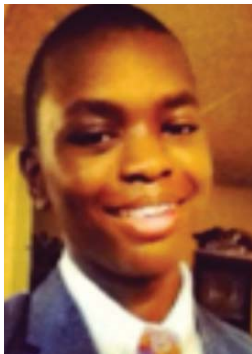
