



Letter from the Pastor



Jesus said in John 10:9,10 "I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out, and find pasture. The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly. Jesus has proved this for more than 147 years at Antioch Baptist Church North. He is the "Door" to salvation but also to an abundant life. Those members who came before us laid a spiritual foundation that has withstood the test of time. We stand on the shoulders of people who had great faith. As our former Pastor Dr. C. M. Alexander would say, Antioch's former Pastor's were "people of the Book. They believed in the Word of God.

I am humbled to serve in the position that these great men served and even more humbled to strive to be what God expects me to be as a Pastor and servant. The accomplishments that we have been able to make in the past five years were because we have a God who loves us unconditionally. I am still tremendously humbled that you called me to be your Pastor and the love you have shown my family, and I makes it so easy to love back. I accepted Jesus Christ at Antioch, was married at Antioch, dedicated my children and grandchildren at Antioch. I accepted my call to preach and preached my first sermon at Antioch. During rough times, Antioch prayed me back to wellness.

Jesus is of course the "Door" to salvation, but He has been the door to us having an abundant life. We have an abundant life not because of earthly possessions but because God has prospered us so well that we are able to help others in tangible ways through our financial support of A.U.M.I. without news conferences and public statements, we give 800-1000 bags or boxes of food out each week. We house and provide social services for men and women who are HIV positive and at risk of homelessness. We provide housing with supportive services for men and women recovering from substance abuse. We mentor youth and strive to teach them to stay away from a life of violence and live in God' victory. We take care of our seniors through our S.O.S program. And we partner with Morehouse School of Medicine and others to bring health care to our community. As Jesus would have it, we do the Work to also be that door to an abundant life for others. We have suffered the separation of so many members and still grieve their departure from this side but praise God, they have made it to that place where there is no more suffering and no more pain. Our auxiliary and ministry leaders have been exemplary in serving. Because of how God allowed our leadership to pivot in response to the time we are living in, we are now reaching more people than we were before the pandemic. The three-deep model that we were encouraged to follow allows our leaders to grow leaders, so the work is never held hostage by an individual.

I thank you for every prayer, every word of encouragement and every expression of love. We have already begun to do the work on the next phase of God's vision and that is to renovate our existing properties and position ourselves to provide affordable housing. I love you beyond what words can express and I thank my entire family for being constant forces of encouragement for me. Each member of my family has characteristics of our parents, Dr. Cameron M. Alexander and Barbara J. Alexander. Thank you to the staff and volunteers who work tirelessly. Lisa, Ashley, DeMario, Diego, Daylin, I and my entire family, thank you for loving us so well. To God be the glory.

Our Anniversary Speaker



Reverend Dr. Rodney Kirk Turner was born in Atlanta, Georgia. He is the son of Rufus and Betty Turner. He is a product of the Atlanta Public School system and a graduate of the Frederick Douglas High School class of 1975. Rev. Turner obtained his college education at the Historic Morehouse College as a sociology and criminology major. While pursuing his education at Morehouse, Rev. Turner became a member of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity and served as president for two years.

He furthered his biblical education at Carver and Beulah Heights Bible Colleges. In May 2015, Rev. Turner received an Honorary Doctorate of Divinity from Carver College for his twenty-nine years of service work in the field of substance abuse and outreach ministry throughout the State of Georgia and across the country. For nine plus years, Rev. Turner served as Pastor of Canaan Missionary Baptist Church in Roanoke, Alabama and is pres-

ently entering his twenty-one years as Pastor and under-shepherd of the Mount Vernon Baptist Church in Atlanta, Georgia. He is a proud father, grandfather, and a loving husband to former State Representative LaNett L. Stanley of Atlanta, GA.

Rev. Turner was licensed to preach in February 1990 and ordained in January 1995 at the Antioch Baptist Church North in Atlanta, Georgia by the late Rev. Dr. C. M. Alexander, Pastor of the Antioch Baptist Church North and President Emeritus of the General Missionary Baptist Convention of Georgia, Inc. While attending Antioch, Rev. Turner served as an associate minister and worked on the staff of Antioch for over seventeen plus years as Antioch's Substance Abuse, AIDS, Prison Ministry and Outreach Coordinator. Rev. Turner is the Founder of one of the nation's most successful recovery ministries, Product of the Power Ministry, a Christian-based recovery ministry that addresses the needs of those suffering with substance abuse issues and other spiritual behavioral disorders. He has authored six books that address how to overcome sin and addiction from a biblical perspective.

Rev. Turner has taught recovery classes in the urban ministries department at Beulah Heights Bible College and has served as a faculty member of the National Baptist Congress of Christian Education, Auxiliary to the National Baptist Convention, U.S.A., Inc. Rev. Turner served for twenty-four years as a faculty member of the General Missionary Baptist Convention of Georgia, Congress of Christian Education, where he taught and lectured on Christian based recovery. He has served as lead columnist for the nationally published magazine Recovery Solutions.

Rev. Turner was a consultant and life skills counselor for twenty-four years with Clark Atlanta University and the Fulton County Judicial system as the senior counselor for Project Redirection. He has served as a chaplain for the Fulton County Jail Division for over twenty years and is a member of the Georgia Sheriff Association Chaplain's Division.

He was a 2017 Inductee into the Morehouse College Martin Luther King Jr. Board of Preachers. Also, in 2017, he received the President Barack Obama's Lifetime Achievement Award for National and Community Service. In June 2019, he was chosen to serve on the Mayor's Task Force to Reimagine the Atlanta City Detention Center as a Center for Equity.

With over thirty-four years of Christ-centered recovery work and outreach initiatives, Rev. Turner has helped countless men and women turn their lives around through a right functioning relationship with Jesus Christ. He is a leader and advocate for the disadvantaged, the hungry and the homeless in the community, always sharing the good news of Jesus Christ. Rev. Turner's motto is, "Therefore, if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature, old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new," 2nd Corinthians 5:17.



Here are some facts you might not know or remember that occurred in Black History during Rev. K. L. Alexander's life.

On August 28, 1963, more than 250,000 people participated in the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. delivered his famous "I Have a Dream" speech during the march.

December 6, 1963, Marian Anderson, and Ralph Bunche became the first Black Americans to receive the Presidential Medal of Freedom, awarded them by President John F. Kennedy.

In 1963 Rev. C. M. Alexander was the pastor of the New Pleasant Grove Baptist Church in Macon GA where he participated in many of the protests held by Blacks in the city.

February 25, 1964, Muhammad Ali won the first of three world heavyweight championships by defeating Sonny Liston.

April 13, 1964, Sidney Poitier won an Oscar for Best Actor for his role in the film, "Lilies of the Field." In 1969 Rev. C. M. Alexander became the pastor of Antioch Baptist Church North.

November 17, 1972, Barbara Jordan and Andrew Young became the first African American Congressional representatives from the South since 1898.

On October 16, 1973, Maynard H. Jackson Jr. was elected as the first Black mayor of Atlanta.

On October 3, 1974, Frank Robinson was appointed player-manager of the Cleveland Indians and later became the first Black manager of any Major League Baseball team.

July 5, 1975, Arthur Ashe (1943–1993) became the first Black person to win the men's singles title at Wimbledon, defeating Jimmy Connors.

September 27, 1982, Journalist Bryant Gumbel became the first Black person to be an anchor on a major network when he joined the "Today" show. He held the position for 15 years.

April 18, 1983, Alice Walker won the Pulitzer Prize for Fiction for her novel "The Color Purple."

February 12th would have been our former pastor Rev. Dr. C.M. Alexander's birthday, and we would like to share a few reminders about him and the mark he made in our history...

The Reverend Dr. Cameron Madison Alexander provided outstanding leadership as the pastor, of our beloved Antioch Baptist Church North for over 49 years. His servant leadership provided strong traditional Baptist values that were Bible-Based, Christ-centered, Holy-Spirit Led, and Mission Bound.

During the early 1970s, he led the congregation to purchase land surrounding the Church for future growth and continued development of outreach ministries that would address the congregation's needs and serve the surrounding Community.

Pastor C. M. Alexander became one of the nation's best-known pastors. He was dubbed as "a pastor's pastor." He mentored, trained, and groomed nearly 150 ministers affectionately called "Sons of Antioch."

He received a variety of well-deserved major recognitions reflecting his influence on the quality of life for citizens in Atlanta and across Georgia and the nation. Still, one of the most influential was having two of his sermons accepted into the American Folk Life Center at the Library of Congress.

As pastor of Antioch Rev. Dr. C.M. Alexander showed us that he was friendly, charitable, comical, stern, positive, imaginative, resourceful, academically inclined, sensitive, and, above all, a dynamic preacher, and teacher leader who modeled Christ.

We will always remember Rev. Dr. C.M. Alexander as an influential, strong historical leader and a road map to be great servants of God.

January 1984 marked the first observation of the Martin Luther King Junior federal holiday.

1985 was the year Rev. Kenny findeth a good thing and married our first lady, Lady Lisa.

In 1986, Oprah Winfrey became the first Black female host of a nationally syndicated talk show, and Mike Tyson became the youngest heavyweight champion in the world when he knocked out Trevor Berbick in just two rounds.

In 1987, civil rights legend John Lewis became a U. S. Representative for Georgia's Fifth congressional district, and the world-famous CNN Center opened.

During the late 80s, under the leadership of our Rev C.M. Alexander, Antioch expanded its real estate portfolio where our new multi-million-dollar worship center was dedicated in 1990.

Just a year later, A-U-M-I was established and acquired the 12-story Walton Hotel in downtown Atlanta. In 1992, the Ananias House opened as a temporary home for those with substance use disorders. During the same year Mae Carol Jemison became the first Black woman to travel into space.

Robert Johnson became the first African American billionaire when he sold the cable station he founded, Black Entertainment Television (BET) in 2001.

In 2008, Barack Obama became the first Black president of the United States.

In January 2021, Kamala Harris became the first woman of African or Asian descent to become vice president.

As we wrap up Black History Month, we pay tribute to Rev. K. L. Alexander and would like to share a few facts about our trail-blazing our Pastor.

Did you know that the first Toy Drive held at Antioch was organized by Pastor Kenny?

As a trailblazer, he was also instrumental in helping several ventures such as AMEN (Antioch Members Enriching the Neighborhood), Dreaming Out Loud (a Juvenile Alternative Program and the Land of Promise take flight).

Rev. Alexander has authored several substance abuse workbooks.

The list of all the valuable contributions our pastor has made is too numerous to mention in this short time frame. Thanks to you Rev. K. L. Alexander and all the African Americans who are still making history. We salute you!
