Our Church Covenant

I. INTRODUCTION

For the week ending June 31, 2011, 294 food boxes were distributed. The value of the groceries was \$7,150 (average cost per family estimated at \$48/box if purchased retail). A total of 21,473 pounds of food was distributed, 648 meals served to AUMI residents, and 318 community meals served. Thirty-six (36) boxes distributed to seniors in the CSFP Program for the month of April.
